Excerpt from April 20203 Board meeting:

Our last financial statements show an accumulated reserve fund of \$36,000. In the April 2023 Board meeting it was moved that we approve spending up to 33% of the reserve fund each year (in addition to income for that year) for the next 3 years. Since that percentage would be calculated from the balance each year, it would be a gradually smaller amount each year and the fund would not be completely depleted. It would return the reserve fund to pre-pandemic levels.

## Funds would cover:

- both business and studio support for the teachers during the post-pandemic recovery period
- music PD and SAA membership for teachers as usual
- scholarship fund for students / support teachers in offering sliding scale
- maintaining summer courses as needed through the Borealis Institute
- administrative costs for the Society (insurance, PO box, bank account and admin honorariums)
- event support
- maintenance of existing equipment purchased by ESFRS
- other items with Board approval

Any funding request over \$4000 would require Board approval, leaving those below that limit to the discretion of the Music Program Director.
